A message from Cllr Georgia Gould to the school

Dear Community Leader,
It is with great sadness and anger that we write to you in response to the terrible attack in Finsbury Park. Our hearts go out to the victims and to our neighbours in Islington.

This is an attack on innocent Londoners. Like the horrific attacks in Manchester, Westminster and London Bridge & Borough Market, it is an assault on our shared values of respect and acceptance that sit at the heart of our vibrant city.

This is a time for people of all backgrounds in Camden to stand united and show our determination that we do not tolerate hate and division. We are One Camden. Our diverse community is one to be celebrated and strengthened.

Extra police have been deployed to reassure communities, especially those observing Ramadan. Our Community Wardens will focus their patrols on key sites including mosques, and we will proactively be monitoring our CCTV.

Please remain alert but not alarmed. Acts of terrorism and hate are committed by a small minority and are not representative of local people.

The French children had recently spent a day in London and visited the South Bank - 2 days before the attack on London Bridge.
