

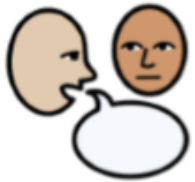
# Odd One Out

# I love maths



Odd	Even

Played like 'Rock, Paper, Scissors'. One player is 'odd' the other is 'even'.

Each player says 'I love maths', as they say maths they hold up any amount of fingers between 0 and 5. The total of both players hands is added. If the answer is odd, the 'odd' player gets a point, if it is even, the even player gets a point,

$$\square + \square + \square + \square =$$

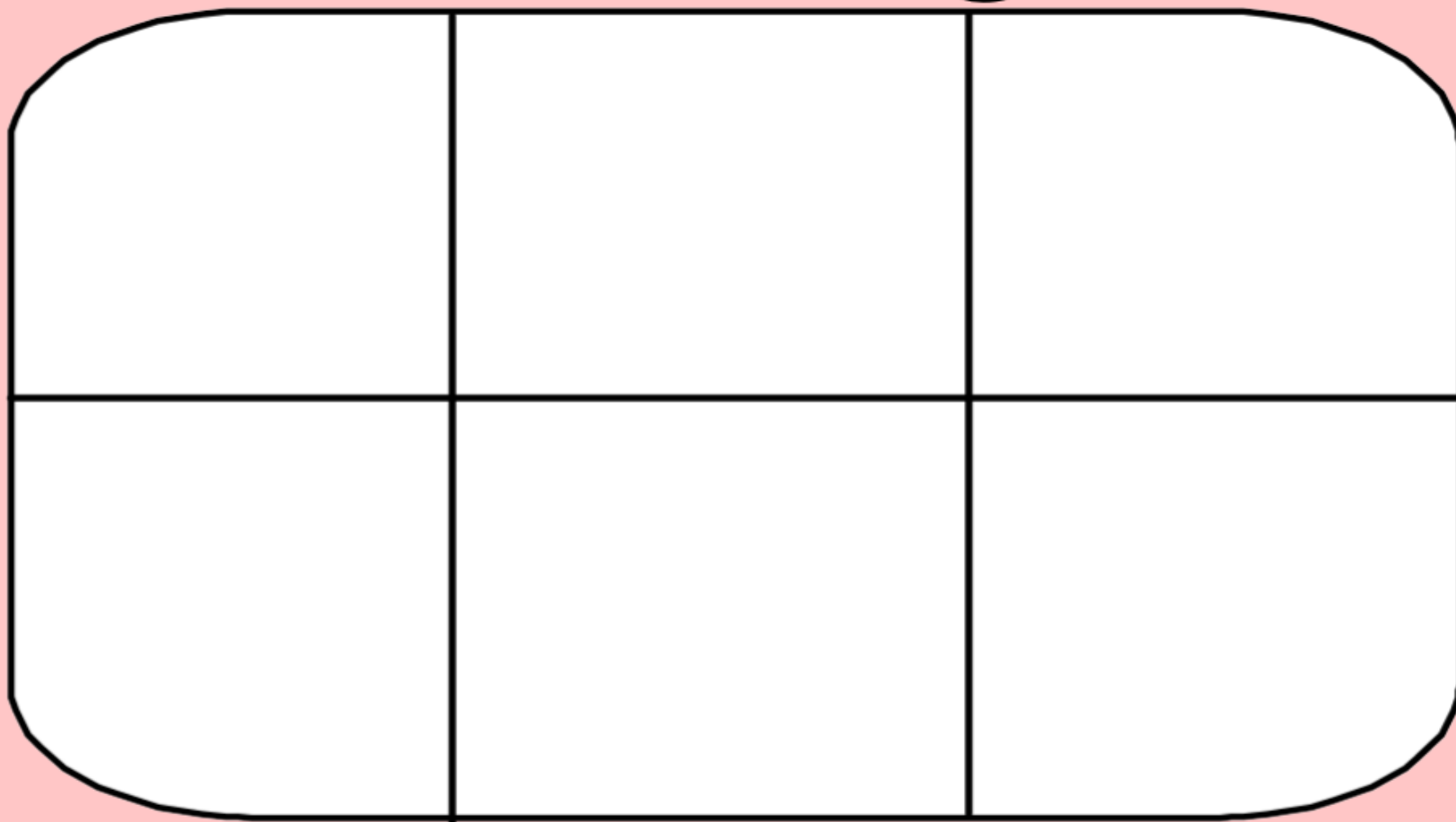

A two player game. Each player is aiming to get their score as close to 100 as they can. Either keep the score as the number rolled, or multiply that number by 10.

Add the 4 rolls together. Whoever is closest to 100 is the winner.

# Bingo



1	×	2	=	2
2	×	2	=	4
3	×	2	=	6
4	×	2	=	8
5	×	2	=	10
6	×	2	=	12
7	×	2	=	14
8	×	2	=	16
9	×	2	=	18
10	×	2	=	20
11	×	2	=	22
12	×	2	=	24

Players write multiples of a times table in the 6 boxes of a bingo board. A caller announces a number sentence, e.g. '9 x 2'. If the player has that answer on their board, they can cross it off. First to clear their entire board wins.
